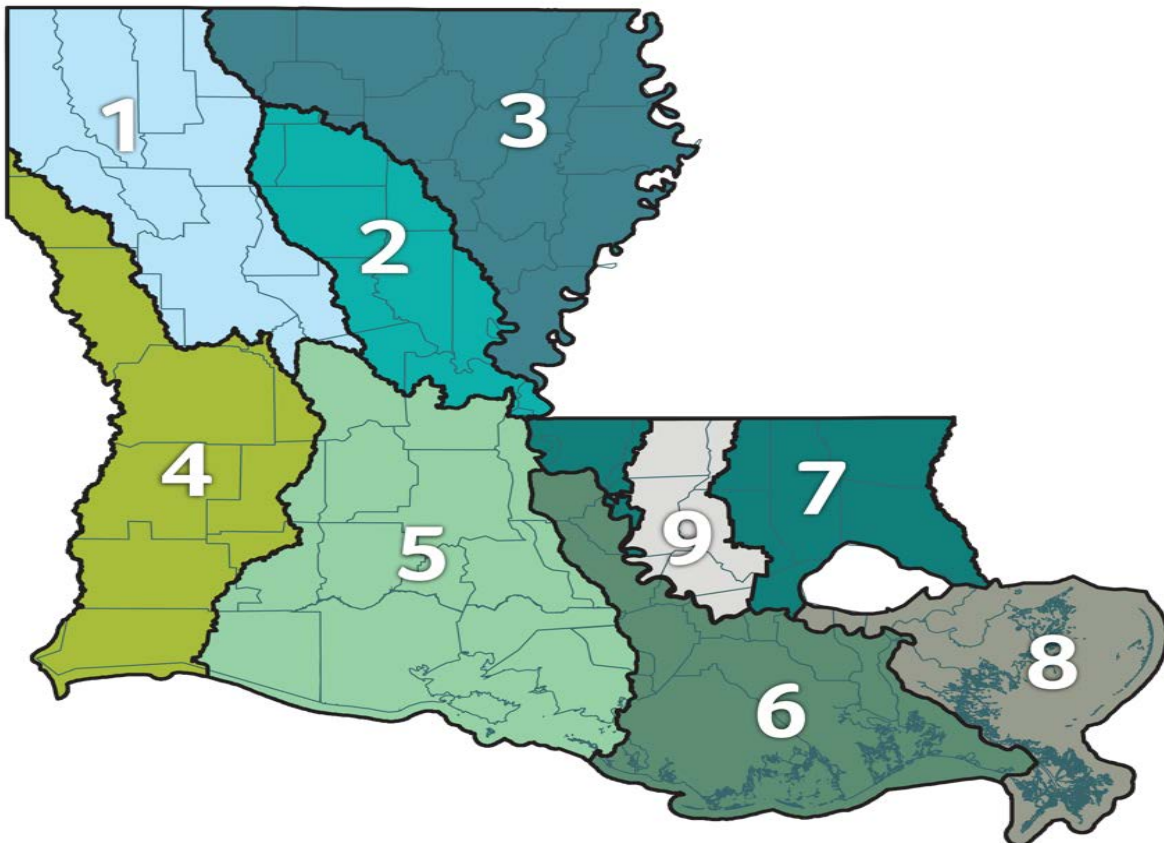
## A. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

The purpose of Action Plan Amendment 2 is to add region 9 as a watershed region for LWI management purposes. In adopting provisional watershed regions, the Council on Watershed Management has considered this existing complex topography and the LWI has created a framework for parishes to coordinate within watershed regions where they have overlapping watersheds or have a shared risk. These regions aggregate HUC8-level watersheds into nine watershed regions for LWI management purposes.

To clarify, Region 9 is being created from one HUC8 watershed that is currently located within Region 7, and that HUC 8 watershed will be removed from Region 7. Figure 1. shows an updated graphic of the nine regions that will fall under LWI management.

Per the state's Master Action Plan, Section IX(F), this APA is considered non-substantial as it does not add a CDBG-MIT Covered Project, change the benefit or eligibility criteria, add or delete an activity, reallocate more than \$25 million dollars or include a change constituting more than 25 percent of a program's budget.
