

Overview

Hurricane Isaac struck Louisiana's coast as a Category 1 hurricane in Plaquemines Parish on Aug. 28, 2012. The storm then headed back out over the Gulf of Mexico and made a second landfall just west of Port Fourchon in Lafourche Parish on Aug. 29, 2012. The slow-moving storm affected multiple parishes with sustained strong winds and heavy rain through Aug. 30, 2012. These severe storms flooded about 17,000 homes and caused massive power outages to more than 900,000 homes and businesses, severe heavy rainfall along inland waterways and an estimated \$1.1 billion in damage.

The U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development appropriated more than \$106 million to Louisiana for recovery from Hurricane Isaac, \$42.4 million of which went directly to the City of New Orleans, Jefferson Parish and St. Tammany Parish.
